The Region Number for this player is described on the rear panel of the player.







#### Tour of the Remote Control



- POWER button Press to turn the DVD-VCR on and off.
- 2 NUMBER Buttons
- 3 CLEAR button

Use to remove menus or status displays from the screen.

- 4 DVD button Use to operate DVD
- VCR button
- Use to operate VCR.

  6 ◀◀ / ┃◀◀ (Search/Skip) button

Press to reverse search/skip a disc.
Use to skip a title, chapter or track on a disc.

(STOP) button Press to stop a disc/video tape during play or record (VCR).

- 8 SUBTITLE button Press to display the subtitle language name abbreviation on screen.
- 9 MENU button

Brings up the DVD-VCR player's menu.

10 ENTER/▲▼◆►/ Channel/ Tracking ∧ or ∨ buttons

This button functions as a toggle switch. Press to change channels. (TV)
Press to adjust tape tracking. (VCR)

11 REC button to begin recording. (VCR)

Press

12 PROGRESSIVE/SPEED button

Press to select progressive scan mode. (DVD) Press to select the tape recording speed. (VCR)

13 MODE/REPEAT button

Use to select the program or random play. Allows you to repeat play a title, chapter, track, or disc. (DVD)

14 TV/VCR button

Press to switch between TV and VCR mode.

15 SHUTTLE (⊕/⊕) buttons

Use to play a sequence at variable speeds. (VCR)

16 AUDIO button

Use this button to access various audio functions on a disc. (DVD)

17 F.ADV/SKIP/INPUT SEL. button

Press to advance play one frame at a time. (DVD)

Press to fast forward a video tape. (VCR) Press to select a external signal source.

18 ►► /►► (Search/Skip) button
Press to forward search/skip a disc.
Use to skip a title, chapter or track on a disc.

19 ►II (Play/Pause) button

Press to play or pause the disc/video tape.

20 INFO. button

Displays the current disc mode. (DVD)

21 RETURN button

Returns to a previous menu.

22 DISC MENU button

Brings up the Disc menu. (DVD)

23 MARK/SEARCH button

Press to memorize scenes for replay. (DVD) Displays the VCR Function menu. (VCR)

24 ANGLE/TIMER button

Use to access various camera angles on a disc.(DVD)

Displays the Manual Clock menu.

### **Getting Connected**

There are several ways to connect your DVD-VCR. Select one of the following video/audio connecting that best suits you below.

#### 1. Connecting to a Video input jack

- Connect a video(yellow) cable between the VIDEO(yellow) OUT jack on DVD-VCR and VIDEO(yellow) IN jack on the TV (or AV amplifier).
- Connect audio cables(white and red) between the AUDIO OUT jacks on the DVD-VCR and AUDIO IN jacks on TV(or AV amplifier).
- · You will enjoy regular quality images.

#### 2. Connecting to an S-Video input jack

 Connect an S-Video cable(not included) between the S-VIDEO OUT jack on DVD-VCR and S-VIDEO IN jack on the TV (or AV amplifier).

- 2. Connect audio cables(white and red) between the AUDIO OUT jacks on the DVD-VCR and AUDIO IN jacks on TV(or AV amplifier).
- 3. Set the Video Output to S-Video in the Display Setup menu.


#### You can use the PROGRESSIVE button to change the Video Output mode.

- You will enjoy high quality images. S-Video separates the picture element into black and white (Y) and color(C) signals to present clearer images than regular video input mode.
- Connect audio cables(white and red) between the AUDIO OUT jacks on the DVD-VCR and AUDIO IN jacks on TV(or AV amplifier).

#### 3. Set the Video Output to Component(Interlace, Progressive) in the Display Setup menu.

You can use the PROGRESSIVE button to change the Video Output mode.

- You will enjoy high quality accurate color reproduction images. Component video separates
  the picture element into black and White(Y), blue(PB), red(PR) signals to present most clear
  and clean images.
- Make sure that the color coded connections match. The Y,PB,PR component output jacks of your DVD-VCR must be connected to the exact corresponding component input jacks on your TV. Otherwise, red or blue images will be displayed on the TV screen.



### S-Video, Component video and Progressive Output Modes

- S-Video and Component video output are available only if your TV supports S-Video input or Component video input, respectively. If S-Video or Component video output does not work, check the TV connections and the TV input selection settings.
- Compared to standard interlaced video, progressive scan doubles the amount of video beam lines fed to your TV, resulting in a more stable, flicker-free, and clear image than interlaced video. The progressive scan video output jack is used in progressive output mode. This is only available with TVs that support progressive scan.
- If you press the PROGRESSIVE button when DVD-VCR is in stop mode or no disc is inserted, the Video Output mode changes in the following sequence:

(S-Video Interlace Progressive)

#### Connecting to an Audio System(Dolby digital, MPEG2 or DTS Amplifier)

- If using a coaxial cable (not included); Connect Optical cable(not included) between the DIGITAL AUDIO OUT (COAXIAL) jack on DVD-VCR and DIGITAL AUDIO IN (COAXIAL) jack of the Amplifier.
- When you connect the DVD-VCR to DTS
   Amplifier and play a DTS disc, set the DTS to On in Audio Setup menu. If it is set to Off, sound will not be heard, or there will be a loud sound.
- Please turn the volume down when you turn on the Amplifier. Sudden loud sound may cause damage to the speakers and your ears.

### **Basic Operation(DVD)**



#### Playing a Disc

#### **Before Play:**

- Turn on your DVD-VCR and set it to the correct Video Input on your TV's remote control.
- If you connected an external Audio System, turn on your Audio System and set it to the correct Audio Input.

#### Playback:

- 1. Press the **OPEN/CLOSE** (▲) button on the front panel.
- 2. Place a disc gently into the tray with the disc's label facing up.
- 3. Press the ▶II (Play/Pause) button on your remote control or on the front panel. Most discs will start to play back as soon as the tray closes.

#### 4. Stopping Play

Press the **(Stop)** button during play.

- Stop/Resume
- Press the ■(Stop) button once to stop playback. To resume the DVD/CD from the point where the disc stopped, press the II (Play/Pause) button.
- Press the ■(Stop) button twice to completely stop playback. The next time you press the ▶II (Play/Pause), the disc will start over from the beginning.

#### 5. Removing Disc

Press the **OPEN/CLOSE** (**\( \( \)**) button on the front panel.

#### 6. Pausing Play

Press the ▶II (Play/Pause) button on your remote control or on the front panel during play.

- Screen stops, no sound.
- To resume, press the ▶II (Play/Pause) button once again.

#### Note

If the player is left for about 5 minutes in pause mode, it will stop.

#### 7. Step Motion Play (Except CD)

Press the **F.ADV** button on the remote control during play.

- Each time the button is pressed, a new frame will appear.
- No sound is heard during STEP mode.
- Press the ▶II (Play/Pause) button to resume normal play.
- You can only perform step motion play in the forward direction.

#### 8. Slow Motion Play (Except CD)

Press and hold the ► (Forward) button to choose the play speed between 1/8, 1/4 and 1/2 of normal during PAUSE or STEP mode.

- No sound is heard during slow mode.
- Press the ►II (Play/Pause) button to resume normal play.
- Reverse slow motion play will not work.

#### Note

This  $( \bigcirc )$  icon indicates an invalid button press.

#### 9. Searching through a Chapter or Track

During play, press and hold the ◄ /► (Search) buttons on the remote control for more than 1 second.

- If you want to search at a faster speed on the DVD or CD, press and hold the button.

#### **Notes**

- The speed marked in this function may be different from the actual playback speed.
- No sound is hearing during search mode (Except CD).

#### 10. Skipping Tracks

During play, press the I◄◄/►►I (Skip) buttons.

- When playing a DVD, if you press the ▶ (Skip) button, it moves to the next chapter. If you press the ◄ (Skip) button, it moves to the beginning of the chapter. One more press makes it move to the beginning of the previous chapter.

### **Basic Operation (VCR)**



#### Playing a Pre-Recorded Video Cassette Tape

#### **Playing the Tape**

- 1. Insert the video cassette tape.
  - For more information on the safety tab, see page 74.
- 2. If the tape doesn't begin to play automatically, press the ▶ (Play/Pause) button.

#### 3. Pausing Play

While a tape is playing, press the ►II (Play/Pause) button when you want to interrupt play. The tape pauses temporarily. Press the ►II (Play/Pause) button to resume playing the tape.

- The VCR does not play sound while a video tape is paused.
- If you see white lines on the screen, see "Using Automatic Tracking" on page 65.

#### **Special VCR Playback Features**

While a videotape is playing, you can enjoy a variety of special playback features, including Still, Frame Advance, Skip, Repeat, and more. Press the Play/Pause button again to resume normal playback.

#### 1. Frame Advance

In the pause mode, press **F.ADV** to advance to the next frame.

#### 2. Fps/Rps Review

In Play mode, press the ►► (Forward) or ◄ (Rewind) to review at two speeds:

- Picture Search: Press and release to advance the tape forward or backward at 5 times normal speed.
- Jet Search: Press and hold down the **SEARCH** button, then release it to play back at the normal speed.

#### 3. Skip

In Play mode, press the SKIP button to move ahead exactly 30 seconds. Press the SKIP button repeatedly up to 4 times to move ahead 2 minutes.

#### 4. Repeat

- In Play mode, press the **REPEAT** button to review the last 5 seconds of tape (SP mode).
- In Play mode, press the REPEAT button to review the last 15 seconds of tape (SLP mode).

### **Basic Recording**

You can record a TV show in progress by inserting a blank tape and pressing the REC button. You can even add time in 30-minute increments up to 4 hours by pressing the REC button repeatedly; see page 76.

#### Note

Be sure your videotape has a Record Safety Tab. If the tab is missing, you can cover the opening with a small piece of tape. Warning: Do not cover this opening unless you are sure you want to record over the tape.

#### Before You Begin...

- Power on the DVD-VCR
- Power on the TV

#### **Protecting a Recorded Cassette**

Video cassettes have a safety tab to prevent accidental erasure. When this tab has been removed, you cannot record on the tape.

- If you wish to protect a cassette, break off the tab using a small screwdriver.
- To re-record over a protected cassette (safety tab broken), cover the hole with adhesive tape.

#### Recording

- 1. Insert a blank VHS tape into the VCR deck. Make sure the tape is long enough to record the entire program. To change the Recording Speed, see page 76.
- 2. Use the Number buttons or the CH ▲ or ▼ buttons to select the desired channel, or press the INPUT SEL. button to select Line 1 or 2 if recording from an external device connected to the front or rear jacks, respectively.
- **3.** Press the **REC** button on the remote control or front panel. For options while recording is in progress, see "Special Recording Features" on this page.

#### 4. Pause/Resume Recording

Press the ►II (Play/Pause) button.Press the REC button again to resume.

#### 5. Stop Recording

Press the ■(Stop) button.

## **Troubleshooting**

### **Identifying DVD Problems**

No operations can be performed with the remote control.	<ul> <li>Check the batteries in the remote control. They may need replacing.</li> <li>Operate the remote control at a distance of no more than 20 feet.</li> <li>Remove batteries and hold down one or more buttons for several minutes to drain the microprocessor inside the remote control to reset it. Reinstall batteries and try to operate the remote control again.</li> </ul>			
Disc does not play.	<ul> <li>Ensure that the disc is installed with the label side facing up.</li> <li>Check the region number of the DVD.</li> </ul>			
5.1 channel sound is not being reproduced.	<ul> <li>5.1 channel sound is reproduced only when the following conditions are met.: <ol> <li>The DVD player is connected with the proper Amplifier</li> <li>The disc is recorded with 5.1 channel sound.</li> <li>Check whether the disc being played has the "5.1 ch" mark on the outside.</li> <li>Check if your audio system is connected and working properly.</li> <li>In a DVD Setup Menu, is the Audio Output set to Bitstream?</li> </ol> </li> </ul>			
The ⊘ icon appears on screen.	<ul> <li>The features or action cannot be completed at this time because:</li> <li>1. The DVD's software restricts it.</li> <li>2. ## **Troubleshooting**

### **Identifying VCR Problems**

No power	Check that the power plug is connected to a wall outlet.				
You cannot insert a video cassette	A video cassette can only be inserted with the window side up and the safety tab facing you.				
The television program was not recorded	<ul> <li>Check the DVD-VCR antenna/cable connections.</li> <li>Is the DVD-VCR tuner properly set?</li> <li>Check if the safety tab is intact on the cassette.</li> </ul>				
Timer recording was unsuccessful	<ul> <li>Re-check the recording start/stop time settings.</li> <li>If there was a power failure or interruption during timer recording, the recording will have been cancelled.</li> </ul>				
No playback picture or the picture is distorted	Check to see if you are using a prerecorded tape.				
You cannot see normal broadcasts	<ul> <li>Check the tuner or external setting. It should be on tuner.</li> <li>Check the TV or VCR antenna connections.</li> </ul>				
Noise bars or streaks on playback	Press the TRK buttons to minimize this effect.				
When the ►II button is pressed during playback, the still picture has severe "noise bars" streaks	•A still picture may have "noise bars", depending on the condition of the tape.  Press the TRK buttons during slow motion to minimize this effect.				
Video Head Cleaning	• If poor pictures appear on a variety of cassettes, the video heads may need cleaning. This is not a common problem and unless it appears, the heads should not be cleaned. When cleaning the video heads, read all instructions provided with the head cleaning cassette. Incorrect head cleaning can permanently damage the video heads.
